


Over thirty thousand streams and rivers flow into it, a dozen of them every bit as big as the Ebro, Duero, and Guadalquivir,16 and those that come down from the mountains to the west (and there are twenty or twenty-five thousand of them) are rich in alluvial gold. Among those mountains lies the province of Cibao17 and its mines, famous throughout the region for their

very high-quality gold. The king of Cibao was called Guarionex18 and he had as vassals several extremely powerful local leaders; one of them, for example, had sixteen thousand men under arms and these he placed at the service of Guarionex. I met some of these men myself. The king him, self was dutiful and virtuous, a man of placid temperament much devoted to the King and Queen of Spain. For a number of years, every householder throughout his realm made, on his orders, an annual gift of a hollow gourd completely filled with gold. The natives of Hispaniola know little of mining techniques and later, when there was less gold available, the king reduced this offering to half a gourd filled with gold. In order to put a stop to the



Spaniards, incessant demands for gold, Guarionex suggested that he might better serve the King of Castile by putting a great area of his kingdom under cultivation, especially as his sub, jects had, as he himself quite correctly asserted, little or no notion of how to mine for gold. Such a plan was feasible, as I can vouch, and the king would have been quite happy to see it put into effect. The area involved would have stretched from Isabela, the site of the first Euro, pean settlement on the island, as far as Santo Domingo, some fifty or more leagues distant, and it would easily have produced an annual income of over three million castilians 19 and, had such a scheme been put into effect, it would have led to the establishment of fifty or more cities on the island, every one of them as large as Seville.20 The wicked European com, manders rewarded this good and great man by dishonouring him when one of their num, ber21 took and raped his wife. To this the king could easily have reacted by biding his time and gathering an army to exact revenge, but he elected instead to abdicate and go into volun, tary exile, alone, to an area called Ciguayos, where the powerful local leader was one of his vassals.22 Once the Europeans realized he had gone, there was no chance of keeping his whereabouts secret, and they got up an army and attacked the local leader under whose pro, tection the king was sheltering. The carriage was terrible and, eventually, they tracked down

the fugitive, took him prisoner, put him in chains and shackles and bun, dled him on to a ship bound for Castile, only for him to perish, along with many Spaniards, when the ship was lost at sea.23 A fortune in gold sank beneath the waves that day, among the cargo being the Great Nugget, as big as a loaf of bread24 and weighing three thousand six hundred castili, ans. 

"Columbus placed his horses and dogs at the disposal of the jaunty lit, tle Alonso de Ojeda, who had learned the art of warfare in the struggle with the Moors of Granada. He joined extraordinary

courage to a violent disposition and was capable of rash cruelty;

nevertheless, he felt that, however despicably he behaved, he always had the protection of the Holy Virgin, a portrait of whom he carried wherever he went.

Ojeda was unusually adept in handling both horses and dogs. When the battle the Vega Real was raging, he released the twenty mastiffs with a loud tómalos (take them, "sic 'em), at which the infuriated hounds hurled themselves at the Indians' naked bod, ies, grabbed them by their bellies and throats, threw them to the ground, disemboweled them, and ripped them to pieces. Bartolomé de las Casas reported with passionate censure that in one hour each dog ripped to bits one hundred Indians and that the animals found the skin of these wretches far easier to tear than boar or deer hide. The struggle was brought to a desolate end with the aid of the twenty Spanish dogs. The comment of Las Casas suggests that these animals originally had been trained for hunting wild game; but, on the plains of the New World, they began, as Foseca had surely anticipated, to savor human flesh. And at the battle of the Vega Real, Columbus, the explorer and mariner, apparently experienced that peculiar and tenacious thrill of the landsman for the hunt. He was impressed by the havoc

his hounds had wrought under the efficient guidance of Ojeda; and as the cacique Guati, guana and his surviving Indians fled in terror toward the wilderness, the admiral realized the potential use of his dogs." Pg 8

"On the last day of August, 1513, priest at Antigua intoned Latin masses and led the lita, nies invoking God's mercy and protection. On the following day Balboa set out with a hun, dred and ninety well-armed Spaniards, up to a thousand Indians, and his dogs. Passing through Careta's lands, they came to the province of the cacique Ponca, who sent warriors with the Spaniards to help attack his enemy, the cacique Torecha, whose village lay in the hills known as the Sierra de Quareca. Torecha boldly defied the Spaniards, who replied with a burst of firearms. The terrified natives lost courage and fled, pursued by eager dogs. More the six hundred Indians were slain, along with the cacique Torecha, who is said to have had his head torn off by a dog. Credit for this remarkable feat had been given to Leoncico." Pg39

"Passing through the provinces of several caciques, whose friendship and subsequent do, nations were won by terror of firearms and dogs, he came at length to the province of the powerful and greatly feared Poncra. Here Balboa's greed soon gave his dogs the opportunity to indulge in more slaughter and bloody feasting.

Having heard of the white strangers who could mold thunder and lightning to their will and of their mangling hounds, Poncra had fled on the approach of the Spaniards.

Fear of the great white conqueror and his savage dogs now had spread throughout the Isthmus and, and as the Spaniards proceeded on their toilsome journey toward the Mar del Norte, other caciques hastened to deliver up their gold before the conqueror could unleash his dogs. But when Balboa and his men approached the province of the cacique Tubanamá, that powerful and greatly feared leader defiantly boasted that he would drag the invaders by the hair of their heads and cast them into the river. Balboa responded by attacking Tuba, namá village in the dead of night and seizing the cacique with all his family and a number of his vassals.

Balboa ordered that the miserable cacique be bound hand and foot and either cast to the hounds or be himself dragged by the hair and cast into the river. Humiliated and terrified the once formidable chieftain promised Balboa all the gold he possessed and ever would possess during his lifetime. At last Balboa released Tubanamá, and filled with him a most advanta, geous treaty of peace he left the province with much gold a number of new slaves on of the cacique sons to be trained as an interpreter and for good measure, Tubanamá...of eighty se, lect and beautiful women."



His experi, ences of discrimination in the navy and in the housing market permanently embittered him."

"William Levites refusal to sell a home to Vince Mereday was not a mere reflection of the builders prejudicial views. Had he felt differently and chosen to integrate Levittown the Fed, eral Government would have refused to subsidize him in the decades following World War II, suburbs across the country--as in (?) and Palo Alto and Levittown--were created in this way, with the FHA administering an explicit racial policy that solidified segregation in every one of our metropolitan areas."

After World War II, the newly established VA also began to guarantee mortgages for re, turning servicemen. It adopted FHA housing policies, and VA appraisers relied on the FHA's Underwriting Manual. By 1950, the FHA and VA together were insuring half of all new mort, gages nationwide.

The FHA had its biggest impact on segregation, not in its discriminatory evaluation of in, dividual mortgage applicants, but in is financing of entire subdivisions, in many cases entire suburbs, as racially exclusive white enclaves. Frank Stevenson was not denied the opportu, nity to follow his job to Milpitas because the FHA refused to insure an individual mortgage for him. Vince Mereday was not denied the opportunity to live in Levittown because a VA ap, praiser considered his individual purchase too risky for a mortgage guarantee.. Rather, in these and thousand of other locales, mass-production builders created entire suburbs with the FHA or VA imposed condition that these suburb be all white." "In 1935, President Roosevelt signed the National Labor Relations Act, granting unions at construction sites and factories the right to bargain with management if the unions were sup, ported by a majority of workers. Labor organizations that gained this official certification could negotiate contracts that covered all of a firm's employees. The original bill, prosed by Senator Robert Wagner of New York, had prohibited government certification of unions that did not grant African Americans membership and workplace rights. The American Federa, tion of Labor (AFL) lobbied Wagner to remove the clause, and he did so. The enactment of the Wagner Act was accomplished with the knowledge that it sanctioned an unconstitutional pol, icy of legally empowering unions that refused to admit African Americans. For at least the next thirty years, the government protected the bargaining rights of unions that denied Afri, can Americans the privileges of membership or that segregated them into janitorial and other lower-paid jobs." 

WASHINGTON, July 25-For WASHINGTON, July 25—Fer40 years the United States Public Health Service has conducted a study in which human beings with apphilis, who were induced to serve as guines pigs, have gone without medi-cal frestment for the disease and a few have died of its late effects, even though an ef-fective therapy was eventually discovered. discovered.

Officials of the health service who initiated the experiment have long since retired.







18 And can you then prevail over them who have come forth together from your city to fight with the whole of them, even if a thousand times as many more should come to your assistance?

19 Surely you know and understand that you do not come to fight with them, but you come to war with their God who made choice of them, and you have therefore all come this day to be destroyed.

20 Now therefore refrain from this evil which you are endeavoring to bring upon yourselves, and it will be better for you not to go to battle with them, although they are but few in numbers, because their God is with them.








"...Bartolomé de Las Casas, who had crossed the ocean many times and spent a lifetime in America, appealed to divine and natural law to obtain better treatment for the Indians, telling succeeding Spanish kings, often to their face, of the sins committed by the conquerors of New Spain." "Las Casas believed the Indians should be Christianized without the use of soldiers or force, only by peaceful means, by the persuasion of the Gospel preached by godly men. He said the Indians were in no way inferior to the Greeks or Romans, not a whit less rational than the Egyptians; their temples, he said, were no less worthy of admiration than were Egyptian pyramids. Showing a heathy disregard for the or,

ders of his ecclesiastical superiors, which forbade the baptizing of Indians unless instructed in the Christian religion. Las Casas was willing to baptize uninstructed children about to die disemboweled by Spanish soldiers.

To combat such unwanted opinions as those of Las Casas and to keep from the world the true story of the horrors perpetrated in New Spain, the Council of the Indies forbade posses, sion or reading of the pamphlets published by Las Casas in Seville in 1552; they even went so far as to forbid the reprinting of the works of Cortes, Lopez the Gomara, and other conquista, dores, though these were mostly apologies written to obtain favors from the crown.





Mitch McConnell: Slavery reparations aren't a 'good idea'

"I don't think reparations for something that happened 150 years ago for whom none of us currently living are responsible is a good idea," "We've tried to deal with our original sin of slavery by fighting a civil war, by passing landmark civil rights legislation. We elected an

African American president," he said. "I think we're always a work in progress in this country but no one currently alive was responsible for that and I don't think we should be trying to figure out how to compensate for it," he said. "First of all, it'd be pretty hard to figure out who to compensate. We've had waves of immigrants as well come to the country and experience dramatic discrimination of one kind or another so no, I don't think reparations are a good idea."

The Assumption of Moses (otherwise called the Testament of Moses) is a 1st century Jewish apocryphal pseudepigraphical work. It purports to contain secret prophecies Moses revealed to Joshua

before passing leadership of the Israelites to him. It contains apocalyptic themes, but is characterized as a "testament", meaning it has the final speech of a dying person, Moses.

There are many sorts of spun cotton, in hanks of every color, and it seems like the silk market at Granada, except here there is much greater quantity. They sell as many colors for painters as may be found in Spain and all of excellent hues. They sell deerskins, with and without the hair, and some are dyed white or in various colors. They sell much earthenware,

which for the most part is very good; there are both large and small pitchers, jugs, pots, tiles and many other sorts of vessel, all of good clay and most of them glazed and painted. They sell maize both as grain and as bread and it is better both in appearance and in taste than any found in the islands or on the mainland. They sell chicken and fish pies, and much fresh and salted fish, as well as raw and cooked fish. They sell hen and goose eggs, and eggs of all the other birds I have mentioned, in great number, and they sell tortillas made from eggs.

At last Cortés surrendered the task of trying to describe it all: "Besides those things which I have already mentioned, they sell in the market everything else to be found in this land, but they are so many and so varied that because of their great number and because I cannot re, member many of them nor do I know what they are called I shall not mention them." Added Bernal Díaz: "But why do I waste so many words in recounting what they sell in that great mar, ket? For I shall never finish if I tell it in detail. . . . Some of the soldiers among us who had been in many parts of the world, in Constantinople, and all over Italy, and in Rome, said that so large a marketplace and so full of people, and so well regulated and arranged, they had never beheld before."

And this was only the market. The rest of Tenochtitlán overflowed with gorgeous gar, dens, arboretums, and aviaries. Artwork was everywhere, artwork so dazzling in conception and execution that when the German master Albrecht Dürer saw some pieces that Cortés brought back to Europe he exclaimed that he had "never seen in all my days what so rejoiced my heart, as these things. For I saw among them amazing artistic objects, and I marveled over the subtle ingenuity of the men in these distant lands. Indeed, I cannot say enough about the things that were brought before me."

If architectural splendor and floral redolence were among the sights and smells that most commonly greeted a stroller in the city, the most ever-present sounds (apart from "the mur, mur and hum of voices" from the mercantile district, which Bernal Díaz said "could be heard more than a league off") were the songs of the many multi-colored birds- parrots, humming, birds, falcons, jays, herons, owls, condors, and dozens and dozens of other exotic species - who lived in public aviaries that the government maintained. As Cortés wrote to his king:


Most Powerful Lord, in order to give an account to Your Royal Excellency of the magnifi, cence, the strange and marvelous things of this great city and of the dominion and wealth of this Mutezuma, its ruler, and of the rites and customs of the people, and of the order there is in the government of the capital as well as in the other cities of Mutezuma's dominions, I would need much time and many expert narrators. I cannot describe one hundredth part of all the things which could be mentioned, but, as best I can I will describe some of those I have seen which, although badly described, will I well know, be so remarkable as not to be be, lieved, for we who saw them with our own eyes could not grasp them with our understanding.

In attempting to recount for his king the sights of the country surrounding Tenochtitlán, the "many provinces and lands containing very many and very great cities, towns and for, tresses," including the vast agricultural lands that Cortés soon would raze and the incredibly rich gold mines that he soon would plunder, the conquistador again was rendered nearly speechless:

"They are so many and so wonderful," he simply said, "that they seem almost unbeliev, able."

Prior to Cortés's entry into this part of the world no one who lived in Europe, Asia, Africa, or anywhere else beyond the Indies and the North and South American continents, had ever heard of this exotic place of such dazzling magnificence. Who were these people? Where had they come from? When had they come? How did they get where they were? Were there others

like them elsewhere in this recently stumbled-upon New World?9 These questions sprang to mind immediately, and many of the puzzlements of the conquistadors are with us still today, more than four and a half centuries later. But while scholarly debates on these questions con, tinue, clear answers regarding some of them at last are finally coming into view. And these answers are essential to an understanding of the magnitude of the holocaust that was visited upon the Western Hemi, sphere- beginning at Hispaniola, spreading to Tenochtitlán, and then radiating out over millions of square miles in every direction-in the wake of 1492. admired by them in those conferences as a very wise man, and one of great sagacity, when he discoursed on any subject he

undertook; and this not only in understanding it, but in

persuading other men also to assent to him. He communicated to them arithmetic, and delivered to them the science of astronomy; for before Abram came into Egypt they were unacquainted with those parts of learning; for that science came from the Chaldeans into Egypt, and from thence to the Greeks also.

If it is true that Joseph and Imhotep were the same person, then the first pyramid (the Step Pyramid in Saqqara) was designed by an Israelite at the beginning of Israel's Sojourn in Egypt. What's more, if

the last of the great pyramids (those of the 12th dynasty) were

constructed with core made from mudbricks which were made by Israelites slave labour, then the Israelites were in Egypt while all of the great pyramids were being constructed. When the Israelites

departed from Egypt in the 13th dynasty, lead by Moses, there were not enough slaves in Egypt to make construct pyramids any more. If this is correct, the Pyramid Age coincides with Israel's

sojourn in Egypt and all of the Great Pyramids would have been constructed over a period of 430 years.



"What Harleston's investigations had shown was that a complex mathemati, cal relationship appeared to exist among the principal structures lined up along the Street of the Dead (and indeed beyond it). This relationship sug, gested something extraordinary, namely that Teotihuacan might originally have been designed as a precise scale-model of the solar system. At any rate, if the centre line of the Temple of Quetzalecoatl were taken as denot, ing the position of the sun, markers laid out northwards from it along the axis of the Street of the Dead seemed to indicate the correct orbital dis, tances of the inner planets, the asteroid belt, Jupiter, Saturn (represented by

the so-called 'Sun' Pyramid). Uranus (bu the 'Moon' Pyramid), and Neptune and Pluto by as yet unexcavated mounds some kilometers farther north. If these correlations were more than co, incidental then at the very least, they indicated the presence at Teotihuacan of an advanced observational astronomy, one not surpassed by modern science until a relatively late date. Uranus remained unknown to our own astronomers until 1787, Neptune until 1846 and Pluto until 1930. Even the most conservative estimate of Teotihuaca's antiquity, by contrast, sug, gested that the principal ingredients of the site-plan (including the Citadel, the Street of the Dead and the Pyramids of the Sun and the Moon) must date back at least to the time of Christ. No known civilization of that epoch, either in the Old World or in the New, is sup, posed to have had any knowledge at all of the outer planets--let alone to have possessed ac, curate information concerning their orbital distances from each other and from the sun. 






White Trauma Though an individual choice to pursue wisdom and rebuff foolishness is important, we must recognize the depth of denial that grips our nation as a whole. It doesn't seem to matter how much exposure white America has to ra, cial injustice or how many encounters we have with systemic inequality, we can't seem to snap out of our collective slum, ber and admit the faults in our foundations. I've heard Mark Charles, a theologian, speaker, and writer of Navajo heritage lecture on national denial on multiple occasions, and I credit him as the primary influence on my understanding of this sub, ject (and many others). A sermon he gave to my own congre, gation sparked my appreciation of the challenges of attempt, ing to foster a national awakening. As he specifically ad, dressed the communities of color within River City Commu, nity Church, he first sympathized with the ongoing oppres, sion that many of them needed to overcome. Then he moved

on to suggest how they could better understand the collective denial of white America. He wrapped it around a pair of words that make a lot of conceptual sense: white trauma. Charles said that reconciliation conversations tend to focus on the historical trauma that communi, ties of color have faced, and he affirmed that this must continue to be the case. The problem, he suggested, is that the conversation around trauma stops with them. But what about the white community? While the traumas experienced by victims and by oppressors are qualita, tively different on every level and can therefore never be compared, it's impossible to be com, plicit with centuries of traumatizing oppression without becoming traumatized oneself. This was a groundbreaking idea for me. While I had grown to recognize the ways our racial history has traumatized communities of color, I had never considered the ways white America had also been traumatized by this same history. I had a new appreciation for why denial is such an accessible temptation for every white person: it's easy to turn a blind eye toward history at an individual level when our nation still does so at a corporate level. When we consider some of the ways we treat history as a nation, we see the fallout from white trauma. Take Colum, bus Day, for example, a legal holiday recognized on the second Monday of every October. Search it online or in almost any history book, and you're most likely to find this description: it's a holiday that commemorates the discovery of the New World by Christopher Columbus in 1492. Discovery? Really? Can any thinking person say with a straight face that what Colum, bus did when he got to America was "discover"? How can one discover a nation that's already

inhabited by millions? Charles highlights how ludicrous this claim is by asking his listeners to consider leaving out their wallet, phone, or iPad so they can experience what it's like to have their property "discovered." Yet we've made the conscious decision to tell the history of our nation as one that was discovered by Columbus and other explorers. Some questions beg to be asked: How have we convinced ourselves to embrace something that sounds more like a fairy tale than a factual account of history? How do otherwise logical people voluntarily look past the documented facts and pass on a false narrative? There is only one explanation that makes sense: We are traumatized, and we are therefore in denial. Acknowledging that all our land was stolen from Native people feels like too great a burden, so we create an alterna, tive reality that allows us to disengage emotionally from the truth. 
A Millennia Unaccounted For



When Tom Damiri dug enough he turned up evidence of humans in North America 130,000 years ago, that was sufficiently robust to make through nature's rigorous peer-review process and into print in 2017. by then it was no longer news that the new world had been peopled long before Clovis in Chapter four we saw that Mount Vernon Middle Croft and Bluefish caves had already pushed back the date of the first Americans from around thirteen thousand years ago to at least twenty four thousand years ago. These however are only three sites among a growing number that suggest a vast complex textured antiquity for the human presence in the Americas, across ages when hither to we've been asked to picture and uninhabited wilderness awaiting the arrival of man. Among the numerous outstanding examples of southwest architec, tural achievement are the Chacoan communities of the San Juan Basin in Colorado and New Mexico, within the Anasazi culture area. Chaco Canyon is near the middle of the San Juan Basin, and here, more than a thousand years ago, there existed the metropolitan hub of hundreds of villages and at least nine large towns constructed around enormous multi-storied building complexes. Pueblo Bonito is an example of one of these: a sin, gle, four-story building with large high-ceilinged rooms and balconies, it



contained 800 rooms, including private residences for more than 1200 people and dozens of circular common rooms up to 60 feet in diameter. No single structure in what later became the United States housed this many people until the largest apartment buildings of New York City were constructed in the nineteenth century. But in its time Pueblo Bonito was far from

unique. Poseuinge, near present-day Ojo Caliente, is another example among many: a com, plex of several adjoining three-story residential buildings, Poseuinge (or Posi) contained more than 2000 rooms.

In the dry surrounding countryside the people of this region-not only the ancient Hoho, kam-constructed intricate canals and ditches, with diversion dams, floodgates, and other run, off control systems, alongside which they planted gardens. So successful were these water management systems that, as Peter Nabokov and Robert Easton have observed, "virtually all of the water that fell in the immediate vicinity was channeled down spillways and troughs to feed their gardens and replenish their reservoirs." And in recent decades aerial photography has revealed the presence of great ancient roadways up to 30 feet wide that linked the hun, dreds of Chaco Canyon communities with at least fifty so-called outlier population centers up to 100 miles away, each of which contained its own complex of large, masonry pueblos. In all, it appears that these roads connected together communities spread out over more than 26,000 square miles of land, an area the size of Belgium and the Netherlands combined-al, though recent studies have begun to suggest that the Chaco region was even larger than the largest previous estimates have surmised. Indeed, as an indication of how much remains to be learned about these ancient peoples and societies, in the Grand Canyon alone more than 2000 indigenous habitation sites have thus far been identified, of which only three have been excavated and studied intensively- while almost half of the canyon's 1,200,000 acres of land area has never even been seen at close range by an archaeologist or a historian. 

1 Nephi CHAPTER 9:1-5

Nephi makes two sets of records—Each is called the plates of Nephi—The larger plates contain a secular history; the smaller ones deal primarily with sacred things. About 600-592 B.C.

1 And all these things did my father see, and hear, and speak, as he dwelt in a tent, in the valley of Lemuel, and also a great many more things, which cannot be written upon these plates. 2 And now, as I have spoken concerning these plates, behold they are not the plates upon which I make a full account of the history of my people; for the plates upon which I make a full account of my people I have given the name of Nephi; wherefore, they are called the plates of Nephi, after mine own name; and these plates also are called the plates of Nephi.

1 Nephi CHAPTER 19:1-6

Nephi makes plates of ore and records the history of his people—The God of Israel will come six hundred years from the time Lehi left Jerusalem—Nephi tells of His sufferings and crucifixion—The Jews will be despised and scattered until the latter days, when they will return unto the Lord. About 588-570 B.C.

1 And it came to pass that the Lord commanded me, wherefore I did make plates of ore that I might engraven upon them the record of my people. And upon the plates which I made I did engraven the record of my father, and also our journeyings in the wilderness, and

the prophecies of my father; and also many of mine own prophecies have I engraven upon them.

2 And I knew not at the time when I made them that I should be commanded of the Lord to make these plates; wherefore, the record of my father, and the genealogy of his fathers, and the more part of all our proceedings in the wilderness are engraven upon those first plates of which I have spoken; wherefore, the things which transpired before I made these plates are, of a truth, more particularly made mention upon the first plates.

3 And after I had made these plates by way of commandment, I, Nephi, received a commandment that the ministry and the

prophecies, the more plain and precious parts of them, should be written upon these plates; and that the things which were written should be kept for the instruction of my people, who should possess the land, and also for other wise purposes, which purposes are known unto the Lord.

4 Wherefore, I, Nephi, did make a record upon the other plates, which gives an account, or which gives a greater account of the wars and contentions and destructions of my people. And this have I done, and commanded my people what they should do after I was gone; and that these plates should be handed down from one generation to another, or from one prophet to another, until further commandments of the Lord.


5 And an account of my making these plates shall be given

hereafter; and then, behold, I proceed according to that which I have spoken; and this I do that the more sacred things may be kept for the knowledge of my people.

6 Nevertheless, I do not write anything upon plates save it be that I think it be sacred. And now, if I do err, even did they err of old; not that I would excuse myself because of other men, but because of the weakness which is in me, according to the flesh, I would excuse myself.





Book 12, The Conquest of Mexico

TWELFTH BOOK, WHIHC TELLETH HOW WAR WAS WAGED HERE IN THE CITY OF MEXICO.

First Chapter, in which it is told how there appeared, how there were seen the signs, the omens of evil, before the Spaniards had come here to this land, before they were known to the natives here.

Ten years before the Spaniards arrived here, an omen of evil first appeared in the heavens. It was like a tongue of fire, like flame, like the light of dawn. It looked as if it were showering [sparks], as if it stood piercing the heavens. It was wide at the base, it was

pointed at the head. To the very midst of the sky, to the very heart of the heavens it stood reaching; to the very midpoint of the skies it stood stretched as it was seen. It was there to the east when it thus came forth at midnight; it looked as if day dawned, day had broken. Later, the **sun destroyed it when he arose**. For a full year [the sign] came forth. (It was [in the year] Twelve House that it began.) And when it appeared, there was shouting; there was the striking of the palm of the hand against the mouth. There was fear; there was inactivity.

A second evil omen came to pass here in Mexico. Quite of its own accord, the house of the demon Uitzilopochili burned; it flared greatly. No one had set fire to it; only of itself it burst into flames. It was called Itepeyoc, at the place called Tlacatecean. When [the fire] ap, peared, already the wooden pillars were burning. From within emerged the flame, the tongue of fire, the blaze. Speedily it ate all the house beams. Thereupon there was an outcry. [The priest] said; "O Mexicans, hasten here! Let [the fire] be put out! [Bring] your water jars!" But when they cast water upon it, when they tried to put it out, all the more did it flare up. It could not be put out; it all burned.

A third evil omen: a temple was struck by lightning; a thunderbolt struck it. It was only a straw hut, a place called (?, Xiuhtecutli's) temple. It was not raining hard; only drizzling. Thus it was considered an evil omen. So, it was said, it was a mere summer flash; nor was there a thunder-clap.

A fourth evil omen: there was yet sun when a comet fell. It became three parts. It began there in the west, and it traveled there to the east as if showering glowing coals. For a great distance it went extending a tail; far did its tail go reaching. And when it was seen, great was the outcry. It was as if [the din of] shell rattles was overspread.

A fifth evil omen: the [lake] water foamed up. The wind did not make it foam up. It was as if the water boiled up, as if it boiled up with a cracking sound. Very far did it go as it rose up, ward. And it reached the bases of the houses, and it flooded, it crumbled the houses. This is the great lake which stretches about us here in Mexico.

A sixth evil omen: often was heard a woman going weeping, going crying out. Loudly did she cry at night. She walked about saying: "My beloved sons, now we are about to go!" 

The ancients worshipped him, and they celebrated his feast day when [it was the month of] Toxcatl, and they slew his representation, whom they named Titlacauan.  - [9] All those things are passed away like a shadow, and as a post that hasted by;
 - [10] And as a ship that passeth over the waves of the water, which when it is gone by, the trace thereof cannot be found, neither the pathway of the keel in the waves;

[11] Or as when a bird hath flown through the air, there is no token of her way to be found, but the light air being beaten with the stroke of her wings and parted with the violent noise and motion of them, is passed through, and therein afterwards no sign where she went is to be found;

[12] Or like as when an arrow is shot at a mark, it parteth the air, which immediately cometh together again, so that a man cannot know where it went through:

[13] Even so we in like manner, as soon as we were born, began to draw to our end, and had no sign of virtue to shew; but were consumed in our own wickedness.

[14] For the hope of the Godly is like dust that is blown away with the wind; like a thin froth that is driven away with the storm; like as the smoke which is dispersed here and there with a tempest, and passeth away as the remembrance of a guest that tarrieth but a day.

[15] But the righteous live for evermore; their reward also is with the Lord, and the care of them is with the most High.

[16] Therefore shall they receive a glorious kingdom, and a

beautiful crown from the Lord's hand: for with his right hand shall he cover them, and with his arm shall he protect them.

[17] He shall take to him his jealousy for complete armour, and make the creature his weapon for the revenge of his enemies.

[18] He shall put on righteousness as a breastplate, and true judgment instead of an helmet.


[19] He shall take holiness for an invincible shield.
